Biographical History:

Frank Gardner Curtiss (1907-1993) was an athlete at Kent State University from 1925-1929.

He was born June 7, 1907 in Charlestown, OH, to parents Ralph Mahan Curtiss and Mary Elizabeth Gardner. He later moved to Ravenna, Ohio, where he attended Ravenna High School. While at Ravenna, he played football, basketball, and ran track. He graduated from high school in 1925 and went on to attend Kent State University.

At Kent State, Curtiss played basketball, baseball, and football, earning 11 total varsity letters. He was an outfielder for baseball, playing both left field and center field at different points, as well as captaining the team in 1928. On the basketball team, he was a forward. In football, he was a defensive end. He was also president of the Alpha chapter of Kappa Mu Kappa Fraternity, which he joined in January 1926.

After graduating from Kent State, Curtiss went on to work at Brush High School in Lyndhurst, Ohio. He was a teacher and a coach, and eventually the athletic director at Brush. He worked there until his retirement in 1969.

Frank G. Curtiss was inducted into the Kent State University Athletics Hall of Fame in 1980. He is also in the Ravenna School District Hall of Fame and the Brush High School Hall of Fame.

Frank Curtiss married Esther Giesler Curtiss, and had two children, Jack Curtiss and Jean Curtiss Britt. He died in Lyndhurst, Ohio in 1993.

Scope and Content:

The collection contains materials from Frank Curtiss' time as a student and an athlete at Kent State University, from the years 1925-1930. There is some general Kent State memorabilia, including a student handbook and songbook, as well as Curtiss' own graduation announcement. There are also newspaper clippings and photographs relating to his membership in Kappa Alpha Kappa. The bulk of the materials are related to Curtiss' athletic career at Kent State, and include his certificates for receiving varsity letters, as well as the letters themselves There are also newspaper clippings, photographs, and other memorabilia.
